Other news is not newsletter worthy, but I thought you would find it interesting. Tense 6 months of tests and subsequent surgery last October.

The outcome is that I am "free & clear. Had a little set back with some "risk-factors" from the surgery on November 10th. I stopped bleeding about 2 weeks after the surgery. 3 days later, according to the ER doctors, a blood clot broke off and traveled .and when it hit my heart, I collapsed and went into cardiac arrest. Hitting the floor on my right side slammed my heart into fibrillation. Marco, love of my life.. saved my life with providing adequate airway and restarting my quiver-mess back into a normal sinus rhythm....and after 5 days of hospital and monitoring...I am

back ...in action and otherwise. It was, to say the least...a unique experience....and perfect example of ****STUFF**** happens. I do not want to think of the outcome if I had been alone or driving or even away from home. SO...Merry Christmas and may this New Year be the VERY BEST for everyone.!







1991 -2013

"Snoopy" as he was affectionately known was purchased by the Jarve Family for daughter Katie in July 2006. Katie and Snoopy got along famously and debuted at Louisville that year winning ribbons their first time out! Over the winter Kate and Snoopy worked on their skills and proved to be nearly unbeatable winning the juvenile gaited classes up until the Lexington Junior League Horse show in 2007 where they entered the Juvenile Gaited Show Pleasure class. There they had flawless performances winning the qualifier and the Championship. Kate and Snoopy continued their success in the Show Pleasure division through 2010. When it was time for Kate to go to Stanford it was decided that Snoopy deserved the retirement he had so earned. Former owner Karen Cox had offered to take Snoopy back once he was ready to retire. He moved to his retirement home in KY in December of 2010. There he had a pasture of mares he could oversee and run with. It was in that pasture he was running across that he died of an apparent heart attack. Snoopy truly was one of a kind.





