


Linda Kane and Into the Cosmos

Hot An Saucy (Theme Park x Babs Gonzales) for owner Shari Rainwater. "Holly" is a two-year-old prospect.





Thoughts on Spud

CH Too Attached (3/8/99 – 9/16/22)
(Finally Attached x Heir Kitty Kitty)

Spud was foaled at Willow Bank in 1999 and was first shown by TJ Santaferria in the Jr. Ex 3-Gaited and Park divisions in 2008. He was Reserve Champion 3-Gaited Pony at The American Royal in 2008 with TJ. I will be forever grateful to TJ for the great early training Spud received making him a joy for an amateur to manage later in his life.

Mickey Chainski purchased Spud in 2010 and Claire Nilsson showed him successfully for a year in the Pleasure Division. Spud came in to my life in 2011 – Jennifer Dixon helped me find this wide-eyed treasure. He was to become my heart horse.


Spud came to California at our local boarding stable as a show horse, by the time of his passing he had become a pleasure horse, companion and ambassador for the Saddlebred breed. Although he had a successful show career (it was a thrill to be an AOT and have him earn his CH designation in Country Pleasure in 2013) his biggest achievement was his transition to all around pleasure and trail horse. With the help of his best Arabian trail friends – Fizzical, Elvis and Sahara, he learned to navigate the trails of Mt. Diablo. Although he was always sure there was a cougar on top of the hills, he enjoyed the trails especially if it was a brunch ride (with lots of grass) and not too hot out.


Thanks to his Aunt Debbie (Bartman), Spud was introduced to the world of Western riding and trail. Amazingly (since he had never seen a pole in his previous life), he became rather adept at the whole thing and surprised and delighted his Saddlebred friends when his debut in a trail class at a local show was broadcast over Face Time.

Spud was always happy to put on a show – out in the front arena snorting and blowing and wanting someone to play with him or with sleigh bells on his harness bringing Santa in to the Christmas party. But his biggest claim to fame was his huge Saddlebred personality – sticking his nose into everyone’s business. Spud quickly became the barn favorite, he had a steady stream of friends stopping by his stall to say hello and he loved the attention. When laminitis limited his mobility, he enjoyed sauntering down the barn aisle (unescorted), snarfing hay and either socializing with or annoying the other horses as he saw fit.


Spud leaves behind his many friends – horse and human, his mom, his Aunt Debbie and his “sister” Missy (his Tennessee Walking horse neighbor) who won’t admit it, but will miss the antics of her “little brother”. Spud introduced many people to the Saddlebred breed and left a lasting impression. His passing from the complications of colic will leave a huge hole in my heart, but I have wonderful memories – he will be with me and his friends forever.


