
I'm so pleased that the first California Springfest was a success!

Minutes from 2017 Annual Meeting of NCASHA

March 5, 2017 Meeting called to order

California Springfest: The California Springfest Show will be April 26 - 29

With the construction at the Monterey Show grounds – that venue is no longer available for horse shows. The Horse Show at Woodside has been dropping in numbers and many people complain about the price of hotels. The decision was made to combine the 2 shows into the California Springfest Show to be held at the Rolling Hills Equestrian Center in Corning California. NCASHA will not be running this show – any members who are interested in helping should contact Manager Kevin Michael or Committee heads Gen Hess and Sue Valley. NCASHA will make a donation of \$1,000 and pay for the AM coffee and doughnuts. We may set up our breed information booth. We will need members support to help with this.

Summer Classic Show: is no longer in our hands. Last year, there was very little interest by the Saddlebred community for this show, so it passed over to the Gaited Breed community. Instead, the club will support the **Harvest Festival Show** at Santa Rosa in October. The show will be run with Marie Boyd with NCASHA and Marie splitting the finances and tasks. Brigitte Scholl, Dana Leavitt, Julie Barrow and Kelly Abbott will head up the committee from NCASHA.

Newsletter: we will continue to print and mail them. They will also appear on the website.

Website/Facebook: Margaret Olney will continue as our webmaster. The site is updated and will continue to post newsletters, updates, calendar as well as point rules and links to our Facebook page and member facilities. Dean MacCracken will continue posting on the Facebook page. Lisa Dahlen offered to help improve and update our website for 2017. There was a discussion about investigating setting up a paypal account for the club.

Membership: Membership form will be included in the newsletters. Dues remain: Family: \$50, Sr: \$35, Jr: \$20.

Breed Promotion: The Cow Palace demonstration fell apart this year. There was a discussion about trying again for 2017, but the decision was made to pass as we would have difficulty coming up with enough horses for the event. Other ideas are the Day of the Horse in Woodside, possibly Dressage in the Wine Country and the Walnut Creek Horse Faire.

Year End Awards: It has been difficult to plan a venue for the year end awards. This year we elected to have them during the Menlo Circus Club show. Membership elected to continue with the award program.

Members decided to include the following shows for 2017: Menlo Circus Club, California Futurity (double points), Santa Barbara, Harvest Festival and 2 other BAFTA Shows. Points would be the same for all the shows except the California Futurity which would be double points.

Discussion was held about expanding and promoting our non-show categories: Pleasure Riding, Open Competition and maybe adding Trail Riding. Members would like further discussion about amending or adding some of the non-rated shows.

Also discussed the ASHA Ambassador program – Jamie Higgins offered to set up an excel program to make collecting point easier.

The meeting was adjourned. Annual Award presentations followed.


Fun Shows:

With all the rain California had this winter, we had to re-schedule both dates due to the weather, but the girls had a lot of fun learning how to prepare their mounts for this exciting activity! They were all given homework to practice after the clinic to ensure their horses would be ready for the excitement of being in a parade.

In late February, the American Saddlebred Horse Association officially recognized The Cheval Saddle Club for Outstanding Achievement in Educational Activities for 2016. It is an honor to have our ASHA Youth Club recognized for our efforts by the national organization!

During the last several club meetings the girls set goals and made plans for our spring and summer activities. They have been busy planning our first Horse Camping trip coming up in June at Rancho Oso in Santa Barbara, CA. Club members have been setting dates, choosing activities, and creating a fundraising plan to make this trip happen. 
