## **THE BIG DAY**

What a lovely idea! Have your daughter's wedding at your horse farm! Before you get too far along in the planning, however, here are a few tips. First, make sure that you schedule it for the wettest spring in years so that the landscape work you need to do can all be started and finished immediately before the big day. There is no point in dragging things out. Make sure that the carpet you order for the entry stairs is back ordered (in China) until after the


